## **Hurricane Season Reminder**

# **Some Helpful Tips:**

**Plan now** – Do not wait until a hurricane is coming to decide where to go and what to pack. Instead, begin working on a plan now and update it as needed.

A Go Bag or Evacuation Bag – Should you be ordered to evacuate, you should have an emergency supply or "go bag" prepared and ready to go. This should include at a minimum, a three day supply of food, water, pet supplies, medicine, cash in small denominations, important documents (maybe on a USB drive) and other necessities.

**Do Not Wait** – Do not wait until the last minute. It is especially important to evacuate early since we live on an island, rather than waiting until the last minute. For example, if you live in Waikiki; the traffic jam that precedes a mandatory evacuation is sometimes impossible to navigate in a timely manner.

# Restorative Yoga at your desk

Sitting at a desk for hours at a time can really take a toll on your body. The following three stretches have been modified for accessibility throughout the day while you are seated, but you can also practice them while

Take a few minutes to incorporate these simple yoga poses to help loosen up tense muscles and get some extra energy throughout your day!

### **Mountain Pose**

While seated at your desk:


- 1. Place your feet flat on the floor.
- 2. Sit up tall, and keep your shoulders stacked over your
- 3. Reach your arms to the ceiling.
- 4. Relax your shoulder blades down your back, and let your shoulders fall away from your ears
- 5. Drop your chin slightly to lengthen your cervical spine (back of the neck).
- 6. Spin your pinkies in towards the center to activate your triceps.
- 7. As you inhale, lengthen through the crown of your

Continue to breathe as you hold this pose. Mountain Pose is great for your posture, and keeps your spine healthy!

### **Seated Half Moon Pose**

While in mountain pose interlace you hands, and extend your palms up to the ceiling.

- 1. Be sure to keep your shoulders stacked directly above your
- 2. As you inhale, lengthen your spine through the crown of your head as if you were lifting up and out of your
- 3. As you exhale, begin to stretch your hands up and over to the right side. As you create a half moon shape with your torso you will feel the stretch along your left side body. Continue to reach through your palms to keep your arms activated.



- 5. As you exhale, stretch up and over to the left side.
- 6. Inhale and shift back to center. Repeat both sides, or release and shake it out.

Seated Half Moon Pose releases tension in your hands and wrists, which helps prevent carpal tunnel and increases circulation. Creating a Half Moon shape with your torso provides a deep stretch and release to the muscles of your side body and rib cage that are usually restricted while seated at your desk.

\* Keep your breath linked with your movements during this pose! This stretch should be flowing, not static-inhale to lengthen through your spine, exhale to reach up and over to the side, inhale to come back to center; exhale to repeat on the other side.

# **Eagle Pose**

- ground, and sit up tall.
- your left arm, crossing at your elbows, wrists, and palms.



- \* Not quite there yet? No problem! Modify by crossing your arms over your chest and placing opposite hand on opposite shoulder like you are giving yourself a hug.
- 3. Reach your hands up towards the ceiling, aiming to get your elbows level with your shoulders.
- \* If you took the hug modification, lift your elbows to shoulder height if that's accessible for you.
- 4. Keep your elbows aligned at the center of your body.
- 5. Keep squeezing your elbows, wrists and palms together tightly.
- \* If you took the hug modification keep squeezing your elbows
- 6. After holding for a few breaths release, shake it out, and switch sides! (Left arm under right.)

Eagle pose has some amazing benefits for your body! Holding this pose opens up your shoulders and creates space between your shoulder blades. This allows the release of the trapezius and rhomboid muscles, where we all tend to hold a lot of our stress. As you squeeze your elbows, wrists and palms together you are creating a tourniquet effect on your joints and restricting the blood flow. As you release this hold you are allowing fresh oxygenated blood to flow into your joints, and increasing your circulation. And to top it all off, practicing Eagle Pose strengthens and tones your arms and shoulders!

### **Follow These Robbery Prevention Tips:**

- Place security signs and stickers on points of entry to serve as deterrents to robbers.
- Be sure you have adequate lighting both inside and outside your business.
- Exterior lighting should illuminate dark areas around your building and parking lots.
- Interior lighting should be adequate enough to allow people outside your business to see people inside.
- Install silent alarms which will give police a better chance of catching intruders.
- Remember to double check that your vehicle is secured.
- Do not leave bags or items visible inside your car and always lock them in the trunk.

### **Tips for Managers:**

- Insure that all employees receive a written statement of key policies and procedures, and that they acknowledge receipt by their signature.
- Make it easy for employees to come forward to report their suspicions or concerns.
- Tell employees what to report and when to report it.
- Tell employees exactly how the information they provide will be used.
- Make yourself accessible to employees.
- Don't criticize employees who may be over-cautious.
